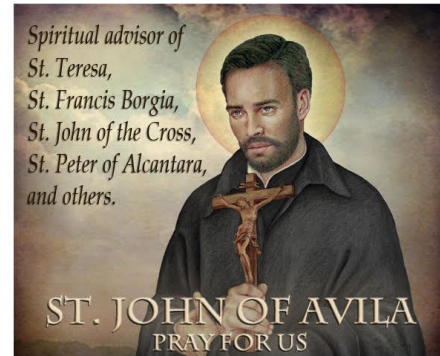

First Saturday Devotion

Our Lady appeared to Sr. Lucia in 1925, promising her gracious assistance unto salvation to all those who practiced devotion to her immaculate heart through the Five First Saturdays.

Five Saturdays in Reparation For:

1. Blasphemies against her Immaculate Conception.
2. Blasphemies against her perpetual virginity.
3. Blasphemies against her divine maternity, and refusal to accept her as the mother of all men.
4. Instilling indifference, scorn, and even hatred towards this immaculate Mother in the hearts of children.
5. Direct insults against her sacred images.

How To Complete the Five First Saturdays:

On the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, and keep our Lady company by saying five decades of the Rosary with fifteen minutes of mediation, with the intention of making reparation for the offences listed above.
